

Lancaster Institute for the Contemporary Arts has a new three-storey building on Lancaster University's North Campus. Built as part of the redevelopment of the entire arts sector, the classrooms and offices accommodate Art, Design, Music and Theatre Studies, and three large public arts facilities are accommodated within a gallery, theatre and concert hall. The new LICA building is the UK's first higher education project to achieve the new BREEAM rating of 'outstanding'.

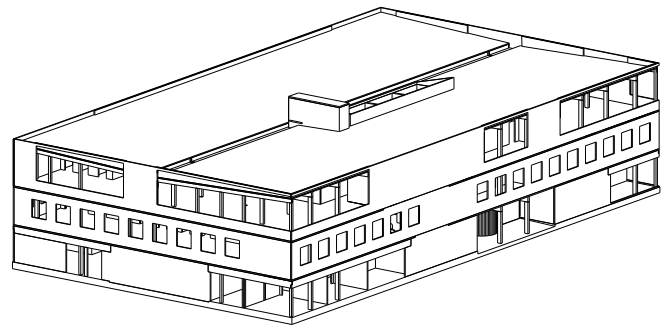
